Values: Values are core human qualities. The principals that help you to decide what is right and wrong, and how to act in various situations. Values may be positive/good or negative/bad.

Positive/good values:Positive/good values mean good human behaviour which lead to do good or constructive things.For example,

Honesty
 Sense of justice.
 Discipline
 Politeness
 Kindness
 Sympathy.
 Loyalty.

Negative/bad values: Negative/bad value means bad human behaviours which lead to do bad or destructive things.For example,

Superstitious
 Socially destructive
 jealousy
 Anger
 Dishonest
 Bitterness.

Source of learning of values:

From family.
 From school.
 From community.
 From culture.
 From religion.

The result of good values:

People trust them
 People respect them.
 People love them
 People like them.
 People help them

The result of negative/bad values:

Nobody like them.
 Nobody loves them.
 Nobody respect them.
 Nobody trust them.

The importance of values:

1.It helps us to grow and develop.

2. To help to create the future we want to experience.

3.It guides our beliefs, attitude and behaviour.

4.It helps us to make a better society.

Behaviour: The way in which one acts or conducts oneself especially towards others..Behaviour may be good or bad.

Good behaviour: Doing good to each other is part of good behaviour. For example,

- 1.Respecting older people.
- 2.Looking after younger children.
- 3. Behaving well with neighbours
- 4.Helping those in trouble.
- 5. Always speak the truth.

Bad behaviour: The person who behaves bad with everybody is called bad behaviour.For example,

Disrespecting everybody
 Fighting with others.
 Using bad words.
 Telling lie.
 Never help others.

The result of good behaviour:

1. Everybody loves him/her.

2. Everybody respect him/her.

3.Every body trust him/her

4.Everybody like him/her.

The result go bad behaviour:

- 1. Nobody loves him/her
- 2. Nobody trust him/her.
- 3. Nobody respect him/her.
- 4. Nobody like him/her.

Differences between values and behaviour:

values

Behaviour

A part of a person's character.
 Moral principals or moral ethics of behaviour.

 A part of a person's personality.
 Opinions about a certain subject matter

or a person.

3.Directly influence by a person's value.

4. The way in which one acts or conducts oneself especially towards others.

3.Directly influenced by family, friends, religion, local community.

5. The principals that help you to decide what is right and wrong, and how to act in various situations.

- 2.Kindness-Helping those in trouble.
- 3.Discipline-Obey the rules.
- 4.Politeness- Respecting older people.
- 5. Truthfulness-Always speak the truth.

Notes:

- Values: The regard that something is held to deserve; the importance, worth, or usefulness of something.
- **Behavior:**The way in which one acts or conducts oneself, especially towards others.
- **Being good:**Having the state, quality, identity, nature, or role in a good position.

Doing good:The activities in which a particular person engages in a good or high standardposition.We have a responsibility to do good to each other.

• Difference between values and behavior

Value	Behavior
a) Values means what you believe.	a)Behavior means the way in which you conducts yourself, towards others.
b) Values are beliefs	b)Behavior is actions.
c)Values are 'standards of our behavior',	c)Behaviors which can be adapted to suit a particular circumstance,
d) Good values make a better society	d) Doing good to each other we do to make society a better place.
e) Example: kindness	e) Helping those in trouble

- Choice: An act of choosing between two or more possibilities.
- **Good choice:**Appropriate to a particular purpose.
- **Bad choice:**Not appropriate in a particular situation.
- A moral quality that you most like to be known for:

Truthfulness: Truthfulness allows us to be honest about ourself to ourself, and to others, and to live a life which reflects that continue to aframework for living well.

- **Example** of how a polite person behaves:
