Lecture Sheet -1

Introduction:

Ishwara is one and unique. He is formless. But He can take any form or shape. His power and qualities are unlimited.

Gods and Goddesses:

When some qualities or power of Ishwara are expressed in shapes, they are called devatas or gods and goddesses. Gods and goddesses are the visible shapes of Ishwara. They have supernatural power. The power of gods and goddesses is the power of Ishwara. Religious books like the Vedas and the Puranas speak about gods and goddesses.

Examples of gods and goddesses:

There are many gods and goddesses such as- Brahma, Vishnu, Shiva, Durga, Kali, Saraswati, Lakshmi, Kartik, Ganesha etc. Ishwara creates as devata Brahma. He rears as devata Vishnu. He destroys as devata Shiva.

Importance of worshipping of gods and goddesses:

- i) If we worship them, they become pleased with us.
- ii) Ishwara becomes satisfied, when gods and goddesses are satisfied.
- iii) Worshipping gods and goddesses means worshipping Ishwara.
- iv) If we worship gods and goddesses, they will bring welfare for all of us.

Worship or puja:

Worship or puja is the prayer or adoration of gods and goddesses. We worship gods and goddesses with flower, fruits, water and various things. During worship we should recite mantras or hymns of deities in holy mind. After worship we should salute the gods and goddesses. The images of gods and goddesses are kept in the temples or at home. We should pronam when we see the images or idols of gods and goddesses.

Description of Devi Lakshmi:

- 1) Lakshmi is the goddess of wealth. She is very calm and beautiful.
- 2) Her skin-colour is fair.
- 3) Her carrier is an owl and she sits on lotus.
- 4) In her right hand there is a lotus and in her left hand there are ears of paddy.
- 5) She has her seat in every house. Every Thursday people read 'Panchali' and worship Lakshmi.
- 6) 'Kojagori' Lakshmi puja is observed in the night of the full moon tithi in the month of Aswin.
- 7) We can acquire wealth and remove our sorrow by worshipping her. She does good to human.
- 8) The Salutation Mantra of Devi Lakshmi with meaning is given below:
 - "Vishwarupasya bharyasi padme padmalaye Shubhe.

Sarbatah pahi mam devi mahalakshmi namo'astu Te."

Meaning: 'Oh Padma, Padmalaya, Subha, you are the wife of Bishwarupa (Narayana). You protect me entirely. Oh, devi maha Lakshmi, I salute you.'

Description of Devi Saraswati:

- 1) Saraswati is the goddess of learning.

Meaning: 'O noble- hearted Saraswati, goddess of wisdom, lotus-eyed, universe-like, bigeyed give me knowledge. I salute you.'

Description of god Ganesha:

- 1) i) Ganesha is the god of perfection or success.
- 2) His carrier is rat. The skin colour of his body is red.
- 3) His head is like the head of an elephant and his belly is large in size. He wears the sacred thread on the neck.
- 4) He has a tooth and a trunk. He has four hands.
- 5) Ganesha is worshipped at the beginning of worship of all gods and goddesses. We should remember the name of Ganesha before all works. Because, Ganesha is the god of success.
- 6) By worshipping him one can be blessed or successful.
- 7) The Salutation mantra of Lord Ganesha with meaning is given below:

"Ekadantam mahakayam lamvodara gajananam

Bighnanashakaram devam heramvam pranamyaham."

Meaning: 'Owner of one tooth, owner of big body, long belly, gajanan, destruction of all obstacles, I salute Heromaba (Ganesha).'
