

Use of an

An= words that starts with vowel sounds, we use *an*

Example: an orange, an ant, an umbrella, an egg

Use of a

A= if any words dose not starts with vowel sounds, we use *a*


Example: a book, a sharpener, a dog, a ball



Indefinite article:"In-" means "not," and "definite" means "clear, obvious.""Indefinite" means "not clear, not exact."

The **indefinite article** tells us that the noun is *not* specific. The speaker talks about *any one* of that type of thing.
