Moral Messages of All Religions:

- i) Always speak the truth.
- ii) Follow the path of honesty.
- iii) Do not steal.
- iv) Respect the elderly people.
- v) Have firm faith in God, the Almighty.

Religious Places of Four Main Religions:

- i) The Hindus call their worship place temple.
- ii) The Buddhists call their worship place pagoda.
- iii) The Christians call their worship place church.
- iv) The Muslims call their worship place mosque.

<u>Main Objectives of All Religions:</u> Submission of soul to the Almighty Creator and seeking welfare for all living beings and the world are the main objectives of all religions.

Results of Disrespect and intolerance:

- i) Disrespect and intolerance lead to alienation, communalism and narrowness.
- ii) There occur disorder and unrest in the society because of these.
- iii) These create strife among the people.

Benefits of Mutual Respect and Spirit of Tolerance:

- i) Mutual respect and tolerance can remove the narrow communalism and establish unity, fellow-feeling and understanding among the people of different religions.
- ii) There are needed to establish amity, peace, order and unity in the society.
- iii) If we practice mutual respect and tolerance to the people of all religions irrespective of caste, creed, colour, age, gender, taste, class and status, then there will be peace and progress in the society.

What should we do to live together peacefully in the society:

- i) We should not hurt any creations of God, because God exists in living beings as soul.
- ii) We should be respectful and tolerant to children of all types and to the people of all religions irrespective of caste, creed, colour, age, gender, taste, class and status.
- iii) We should be ready to invite all the people belonging to different religions to all social and religious functions and occasions.
- iv) We should also be delightful if we are invited to others social and religious functions.
