



Verbs are action words. When we see a word that means an action, such as the word "run" that is a verb.

Some examples:

Verb **Example** Afford I can't afford to spend any more money this week. **Agree** Why did you agree to meet her in the first place? Aim We aim to increase the speed of delivery. **Appear** Police say there appear to be signs of a break-in. **Attempt** Are you going to attempt to pass the exam? Ask Historians frequently ask to consult the collection. **Arrange** Have you arranged to meet Mark this weekend?

Types of Verbs

Doing verbs: are words that express physical action. Example: work, run, seat etc.

Saying verb: express a spoken action. Example: talk, tell, said etc.

Thinking verb: these verbs express action that happen mentally. Example: understand, believe, think etc.

Being and having verb: these verbs tell what things are and what they have. Example: Ben is a good singer. Ali has a car.
