Duty:

A duty is a commitment or expectation to perform some action in general.

Example: It's my duty to uphold the law.

Responsibility:

The state or fact of having a duty to deal with something.

Example: I should share my food with others who need it.

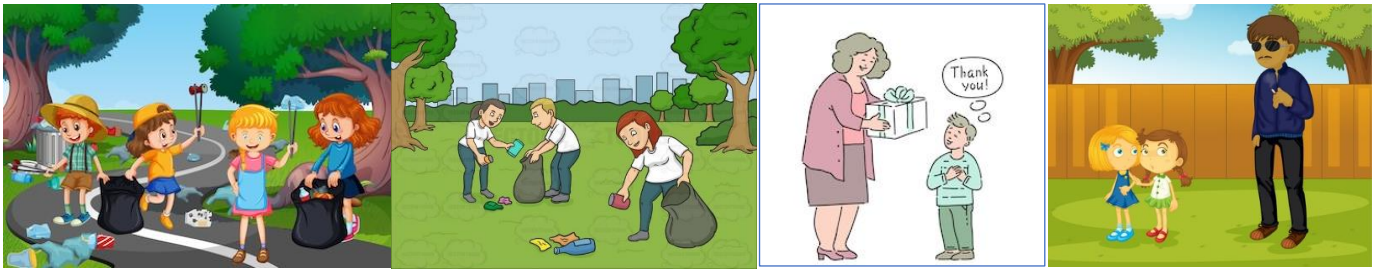
Society:

A society is made up of a group of people sharing the same geographical territory, culture and language. No one can live alone. We live by helping each other in a society.



Duties towards the society:

- Look after younger children
- Help anyone in need
- Respect older people
- Protect our local amenities, such as parks and playgrounds
- Be safe on the roads
- Be aware of 'stranger danger'
- Not harm anyone
- Obey the rules and regulations of society etc.



Responsibilities towards the society:

- Following the norms and conducts of the society.
- Helping the underprivileged members of the society.
- To help in the different works of the society.
- Protect the local amenities such as parks, playgrounds etc.

Story about Rakib 'Stranger Danger':

Rakib went outside alone to play with his friends. Night fell, but Rakib did not return. Rakib's parents informed the police. After ten days the police rescued Rakib from a village. It is known that two strangers took Rakib to a shop and gave him an ice cream which made him unconscious. They took him away and kept him captive and asked for 10 lac takas as ransom money from Rakib's family.

Basic Stranger Danger Rules:

- never go anywhere with a stranger
- never accept gifts or sweets from a stranger
- never get in a car with a stranger

- never go off on your own without telling your parents or a trusted adult
- if you feel you are in danger then you have to YELL, KICK, SCREAM, LIE or RUN AWAY.
- stay with friends and do not go anywhere alone e.g. to the park on your own etc.

Helping the older members in your family:

We will help the older people of the family because that's our duties towards them.

- Wash their clothes.
- Bring them anything they need.
- Remind them to take medicine timely.
- Take them to the nearby parks in the afternoon.
- Read to them or go for walks together, etc.
