## **Preposition:**

A preposition is a word used to link nouns, pronouns, or phrases to other words within a sentence.

Or,

Prepositions are words that placed directly before nouns or anything equivalent to nouns.

## **Example:**

- I prefer to read **in** the library.
- Complete the assignment **by** Friday.
- He sat on a chair. etc.

[\*Prepositions act to connect the people, objects, time and locations in a sentence. So, prepositions are relating words.]
