

1. Assertive Sentence:

A sentence that tells us something is called assertive sentence. It always ends with a full stop (.)

Example:

1. She is reading.
2. I study regularly.
3. Water Lily is our national flower.
4. Jane likes sweet.
5. You are my best friend.

2. Interrogative Sentence:

The sentence that asks a question is an interrogative sentence. It always ends with a question sign (?).

Example:

1. What is your name?
2. What class do you read in?
3. Do you like chocolate?
4. What is our national fruit?
5. What time is it now?
