Conjunctions**Because**

- **Because** the conjunction is used when stating the reason for a sentence. Indicates what an event, result, or situation originated from. Because the reason comes after the connector.

Example Sentences

- He had to continue his work immediately **because** it was too late.
- Her mother suddenly became very angry with her child **because** her child was very worried.
- As a result, these issues are not for you **because** your age is much younger.
- I don't want you to talk to me again **because** you lied to me.
- I could not go to school early **because** I studied lesson until last night.

Before

- Before sits to refer previous time.

Example

1. I brush my teeth before sleep.
2. I put on my school dress before school.
3. I have my breakfast before going to school.
4. I take my book before class.
5. I do my homework before going to bed.

After

- After refers later time.

1. I will do my homework after lunch.
2. I will go to school after taking breakfast.
3. I will brush my teeth after breakfast.
4. I will wash my hands after lunch.
5. I will play after doing my home work.
6. I will sleep after supper.

'After', 'Before', and 'When'

The conjunction 'after', 'before', and 'when' are time conjunction which are used to explain and give information about the chronological order of activities. For examples :

- Before sleeping, it is better to pray.
- After finishing your homework, you had better sleep.
- When drinking water, you'd better not gulp it down.
