

Prepositions



Preposition (Day 2)

A preposition is a word that the relationship between noun or pronoun and other words in a sentence. Prepositions often tell us the positions of things.

Use of *with*:

Used to indicate being together or being involved or having something:

- I am going to market with my mother.
- She was with me when we were playing outside.
- I met a girl with blue eyes.
- The kids are busy with their homework.
- I am blessed with good health.
- Be careful with the glasses.
- They were playing outside with football.

Use of *for*:

Used to indicate the use of something or to mean because of.

- She is waiting for me.
- Let us wait for Sally.
- I baked a cake for my mom's birthday.

- I am so happy for you.
- We feel deeply sorry for your loss.
- For this reason, I've decided to quit this job.
- I was late for traffic jam.

Use of *In*:

Used to indicate location.

- The teddy is in the cupboard.
- I am in my friend's place now.
- He sits in the back off the chair.
- There are kites in the sky.

Use of *from*:

Used to indicate where something or somebody starts / origin of something or somebody.

- We buy our apples from Mr. Johns.

- She bought the mangos from Rajshahi.
- I am from Italy.
- The butter melted because the heat came from the sun.

Use of by:

Used to indicate how something is done.

We contact the Dr. by phone or by e-mail.

He paid the bill by cash.

He came to his mother by train.

The boy was hit by a car.

They came to my home by taxi.
