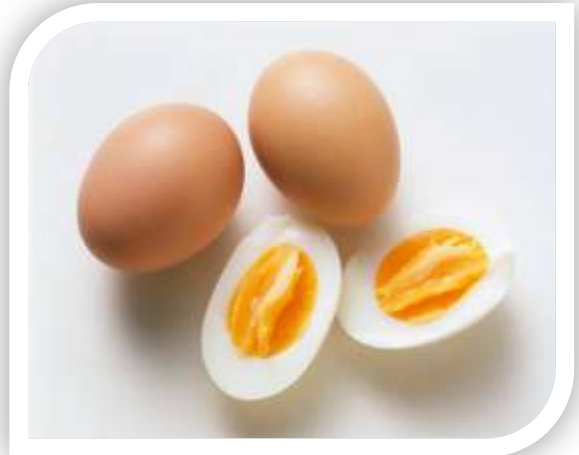
*Example: a book, a sharpener, a dog, a ball*

**Indefinite article:** "**In-**" means "not," and "**definite**" means "clear, obvious." "**Indefinite**" means "not clear, not exact."

The **indefinite article** tells us that the noun is *not* specific. The speaker talks about *any one* of that type of thing.

**Examples:**

A car, a dancer, a dog, a building, a cat

an ant, an eye, an ice, an owl, an umbrella ( words starts with vowel sounds)

**The definite article means clear, obvious. It tells us that the noun is specific.  
The speaker talks about a particular thing.**

"**The** car I bought broke down."

"**The** actors were really good."
