Preposition

A preposition is a word that the relationship between noun or pronoun and other words in a sentence. Prepositions often tell us the positions of things.



The boy is standing **between** the chairs.



The puppy is trying to sit **beside** his sofa.



The girl is hiding **under** her bed.

The cat is sleeping **inside** the box.

Use of Into	Use of Inside
<p><i>Into</i> usually expresses the movement of something towards or something else.</p> <p>Example:</p> <p>His words put courage <i>into</i> my heart.</p> <p>Do not come <i>into</i> my room without knocking.</p> <p>Mom looked <i>into</i> my eyes when I lie.</p>	<p><i>Inside</i> usually used when we refer to the inner part of something.</p> <p>Example:</p> <p>I am going to sit <i>inside</i> the car.</p> <p>We are <i>inside</i> your room.</p> <p>I live <i>inside</i> the city limits.</p> <p>Wait for your mom <i>inside</i> the school.</p>
