Preposition (Day 3)

A preposition is a word that the relationship between noun or pronoun and other words in a sentence. Prepositions often tell us the positions of things.

Use of :

Used to indicate relationships between other words, such as *to indicate reference*

- The box is full **of** toys.
- This is the picture **of** my last birthday.

Use of *off*:

Off is usually indicate separation or disconnection.

- The baby take **off** her clothes.
- They cut a branch **off** the tree.

Use of *down*:

Down usually followed by noun. It indicated both direction and location.

- She was walking down the street.
- Sit down and take your pencil.

Use of below:

It usually indicate lower any place that is not directly under another.

- Millions of people still live below the poverty line.
- Our apartment is below theirs.
- The plane is just below the cloud.

Use of over:

It usually indicate to movement and position of things. It talks about movement or position at a higher level than something else.

- You finished the movie over internet.
- The dog jumped over the window.
- He is famous all over the world.
