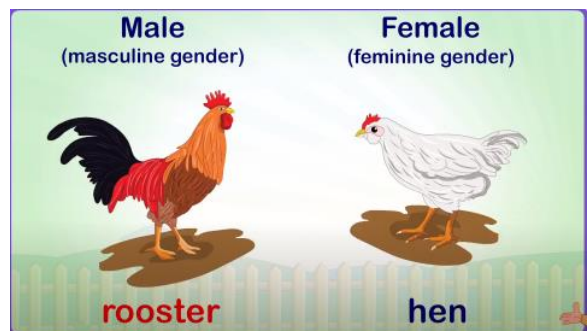
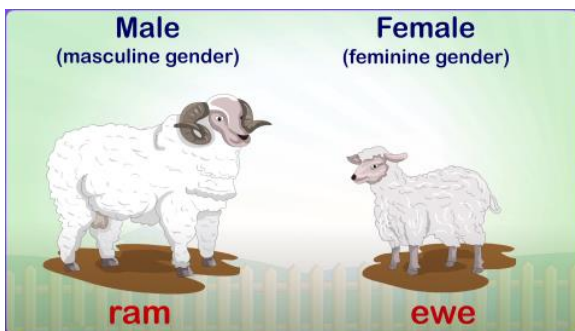
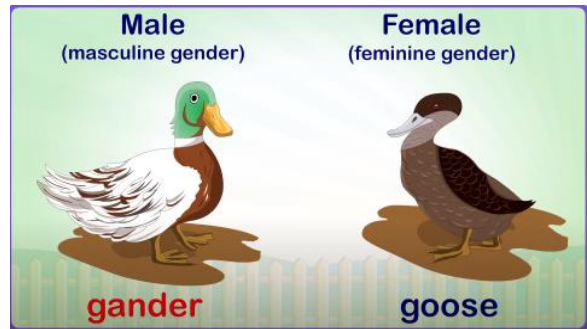
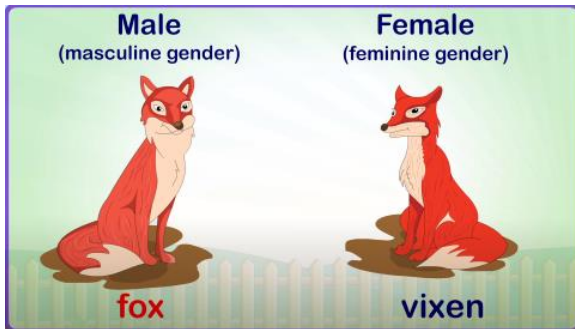
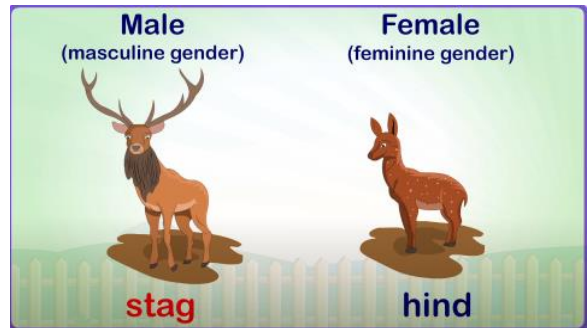
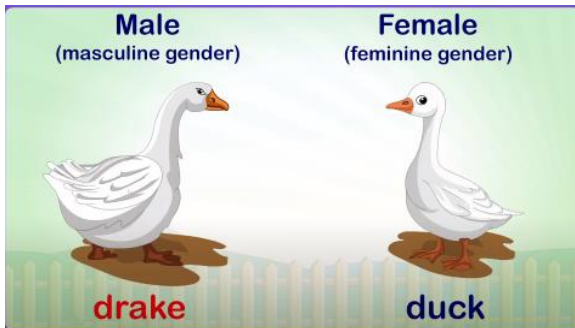
Feminine Gender

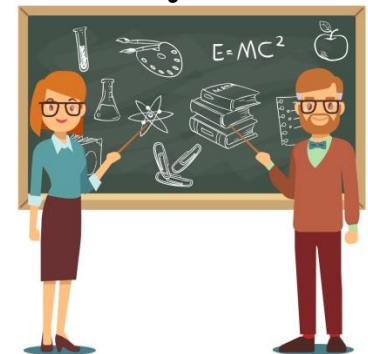

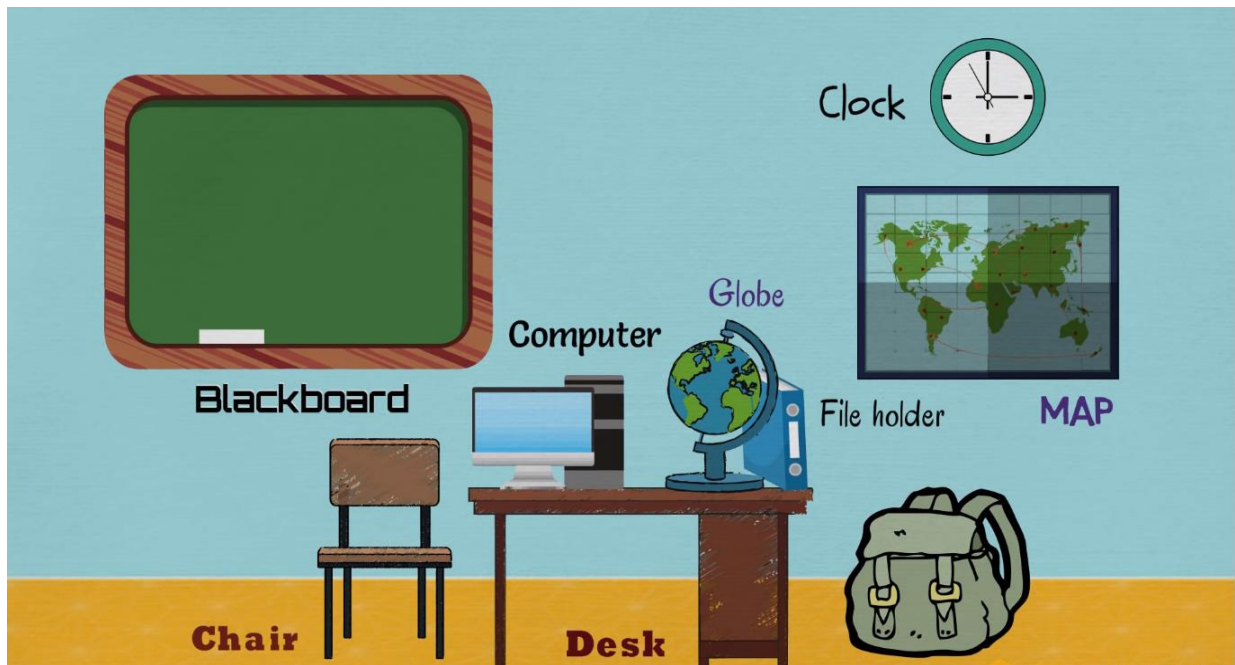
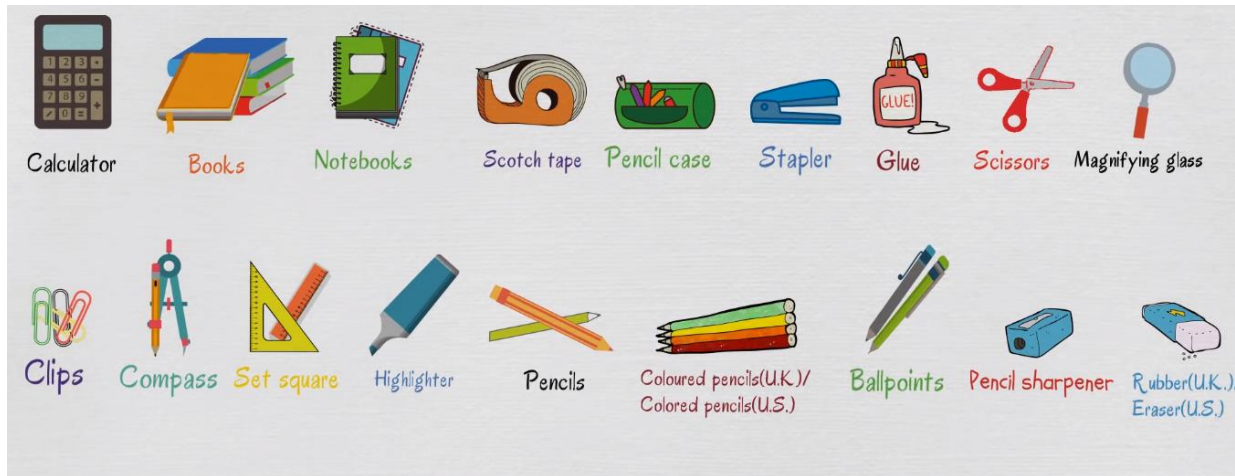

Neuter Gender

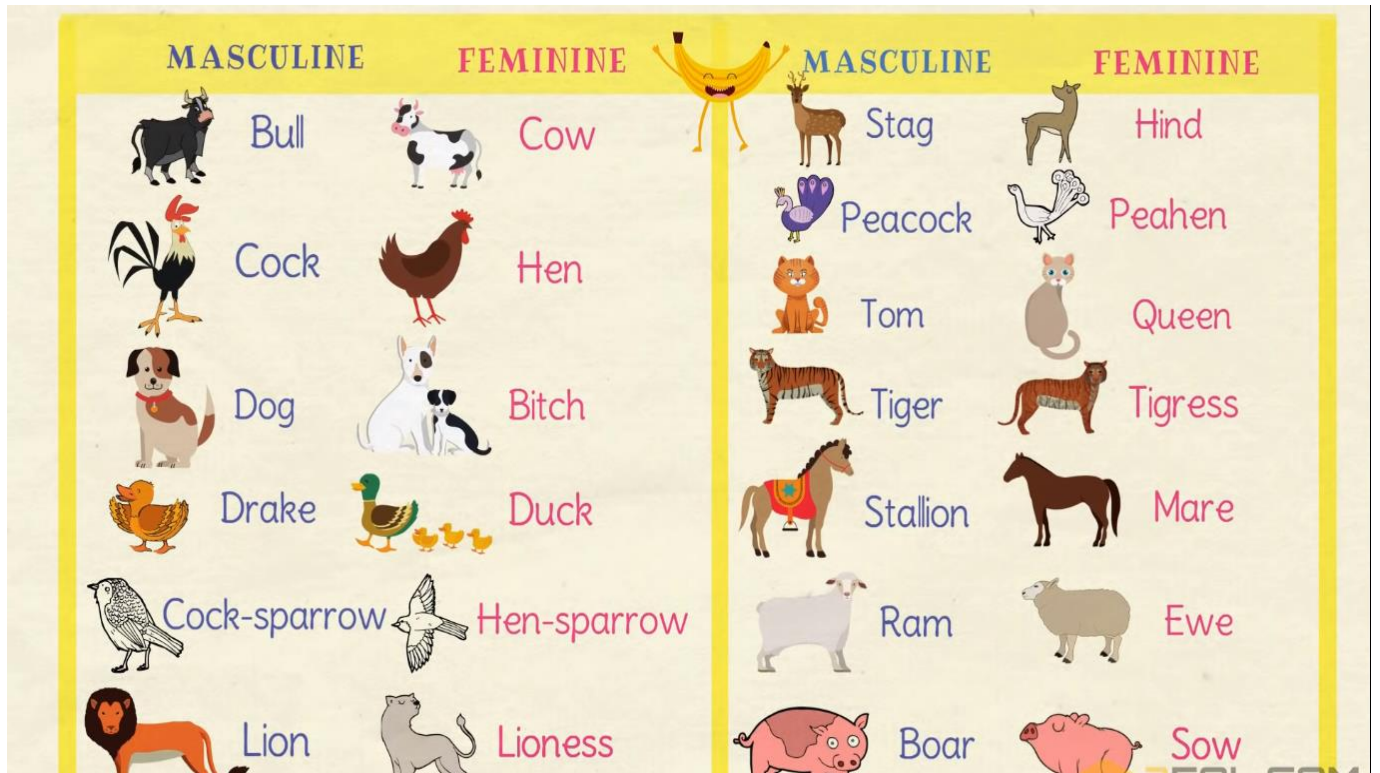
Noun that refers to a thing (non-living) that is neither a male nor a female is said to be of the neuter gender.
