### Topic-4: The violation of women's rights

- **Violation:** An action of violating someone or something.
- Women's rights:



Women's rights are the rights and entitlements claimed for women and girls worldwide. These rights include the right to live, free from violence, to be educated, to own property, and to earn a fair and equal wage.

## • Violation against women:

Violation against women by which women are forced into a subordinate position compared with and can take many forms.

### • Examples of violation of women's rights:

- 1. Girls may not receive equal education to boys.
- 2. Women may not be given equal jobs to men.
- 3. Women at work may not receive equal pay to men.
- 4. Women may not receive equal rights in family.
- 5. Domestic helpers may not be given the pay or food or health care that they are entitled to.
- 6. Women are trafficked in other countries for doing odd jobs.
- 7. Women are also subject to domestic violence and workplace harassments etc.











# • What can we do about women's rights violation?

- 1. Educate ourselves of violation against women.
- 2. Learn the facts and the prevalence.
- 3. Give the proper pay or food or health care to domestic helpers that they are entitled to.
- 4. We should not tolerate these situations.

- 5. We should fight for the rights of everyone to be treated equally etc.
- Early 9<sup>th</sup> Century Women were:
  - Unable to vote.
  - Legal status of a minor.
  - Single—could own her own property.
  - Married—no control over her property.
  - Or her children.
  - Could not initiate divorce.
  - Couldn't make wills, sigh a contract, or bring suit in court without her husband's permission etc.
